Overview

HBG's latest 3D printed set features the XP-67 Bat Bomber Interceptor. These rules are written Global War - 2nd edition, however at the end of this document are a few changes necessary to play these with Global War 1st edition or Axis and Allies 1940. All of our sets feature a letter designation so they can be referenced in future rules. This set is TDPX.

Set Contents

XP-67 Bat (3d Printed in White or Painted Green)

TDPV 1.0 XP-67 Bat Bomber Interceptor

The McDonnell XP-67 Bat or "Moonbat" was a twin-engine long-range interceptor built to take out high-altitude bombers. Armed with six 37mm cannons it had truly impressive firepower. (Other designs even feature a 75mm cannon but those were ultimately rejected). Had the project gone forward it would have produced an interceptor with a range of 2,385 miles (3,837km).

Interceptor: The XP-67 has target selection 1-3 (air). It does not cause casualties to ships or submarines.

Improved Interception: The XP-67 has an interception value of (3)

Interceptor: The XP-67 has target selection "1-2" (air units).

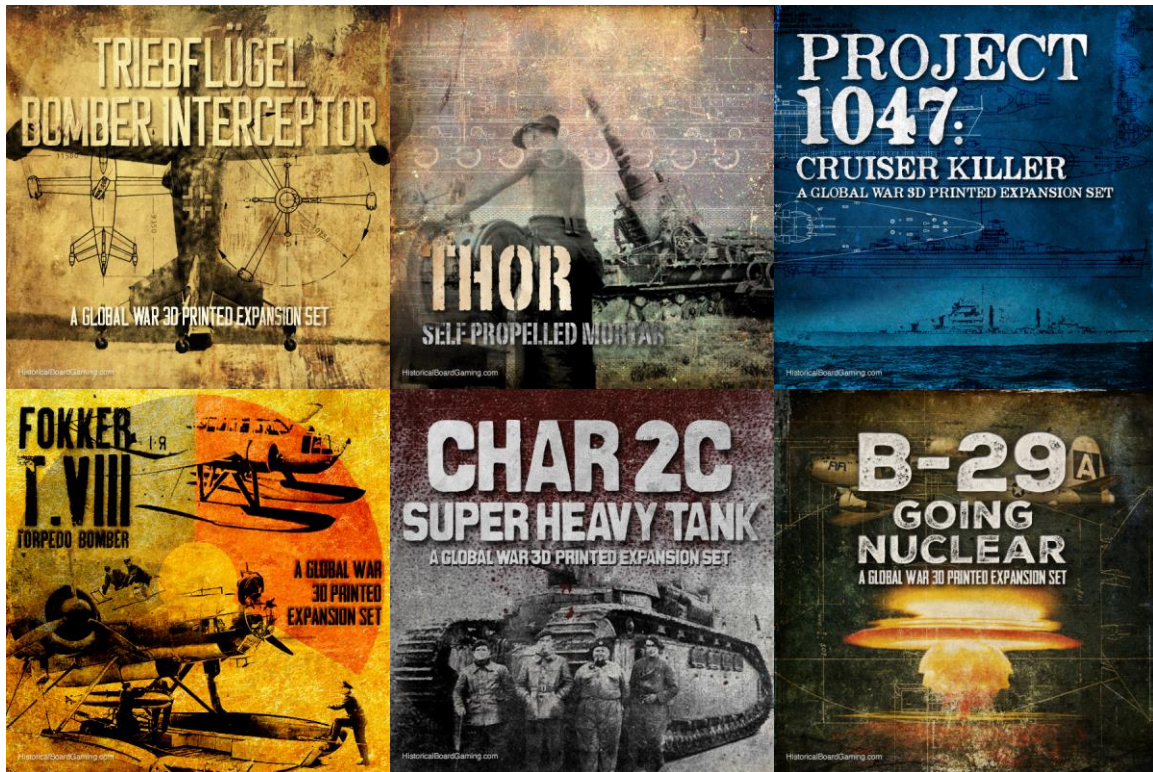
DESIGN NOTES

The XP-67 Moonbat is an unusual unit. It is the first time we have attempted to represent a true interceptor rather than simply a “fighter” which has fairly similar ground, air and naval attack capabilities. The Moonbat has a unique aircraft target selection ability, giving it good chance of causing aircraft casualties each round. Such a weapon could turn tide to the Allies side by taking out high value aircraft early in the battle.
